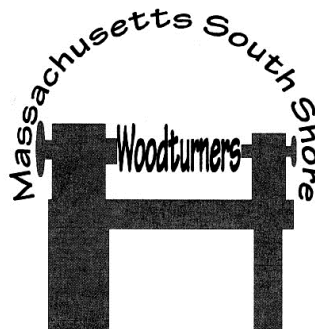

There were around 35-40 attendees. There were over 60 items to be voted on so most (but not all) made it into the JP show.

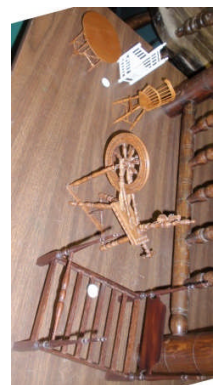


On the table up front where the cups are pictured are three items with no cups or numbers for voting. That is because these are wall hangings and they need as many as they can get hence they are automatically selected.

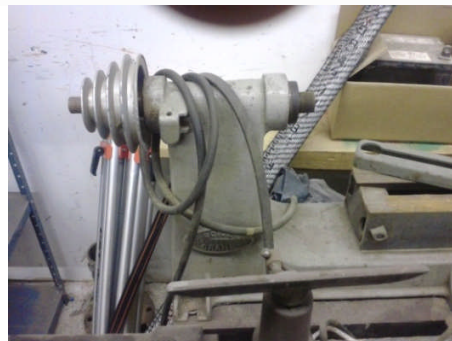
Two Free Boice-Crane lathes available from John Shooshan shoo28@aol.com
