## Meeting Minutes

### President's Report and General Business

Correspondence was received from South Shore Art Center announcing their Blue Ribbon Member's Show, July 18-Sept. 7, and The Plymouth Guild who will be holding a juried show September 16th.

A registration form is available on the internet for the Totally Turning Symposium to be held October 25th and 26th at Sage College Campus, Albany, NY. A few members plan to attend. The registration fee is \$75.00.

Hank received a letter from George Paes, President of Central Coast Woodturners, San Luis Obispo, CA., who was an early member of CNEW, and neighbor of RI Senator Bates. He received a video tape from the Senator of our Dome Citation presentation and forwarded a copy to Mary Lacer, AAW Administrator.
