Two ties

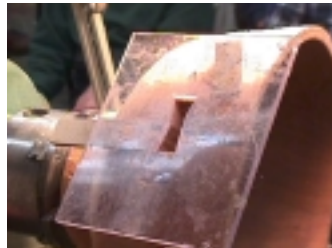


When you get carried away!

Also known as a butterfly key or inlay. Used by George Nakashima for functional and decorative effect. Used by Wally to save a cracked turning and add an artistic inlay to raise the price of the piece.



An acrylic template is fastened over the crack in bowl with hot glue and wedges to support.



Rout bow tie cutout with straight or spiral bit and collar. Clean up corners and glue in contrasting bow tie.

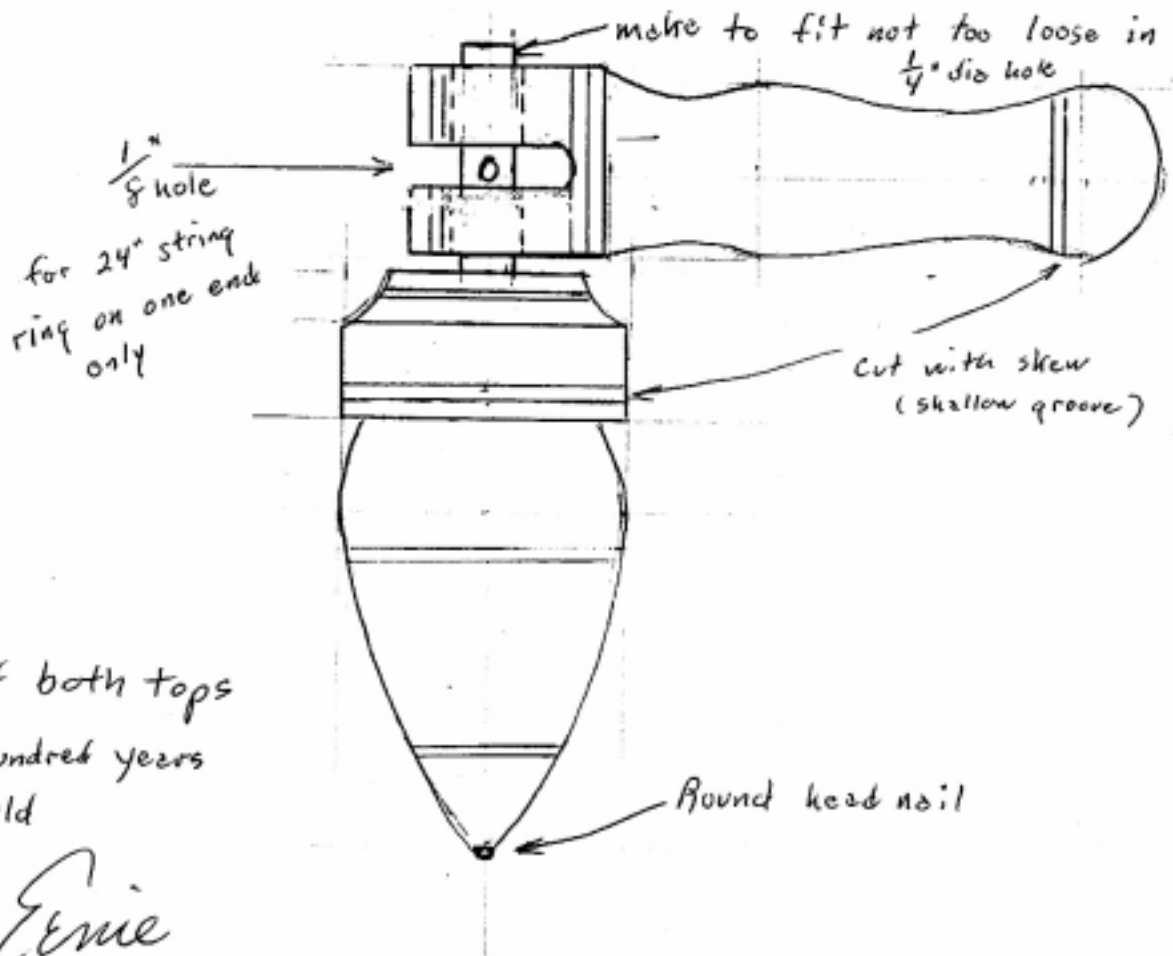
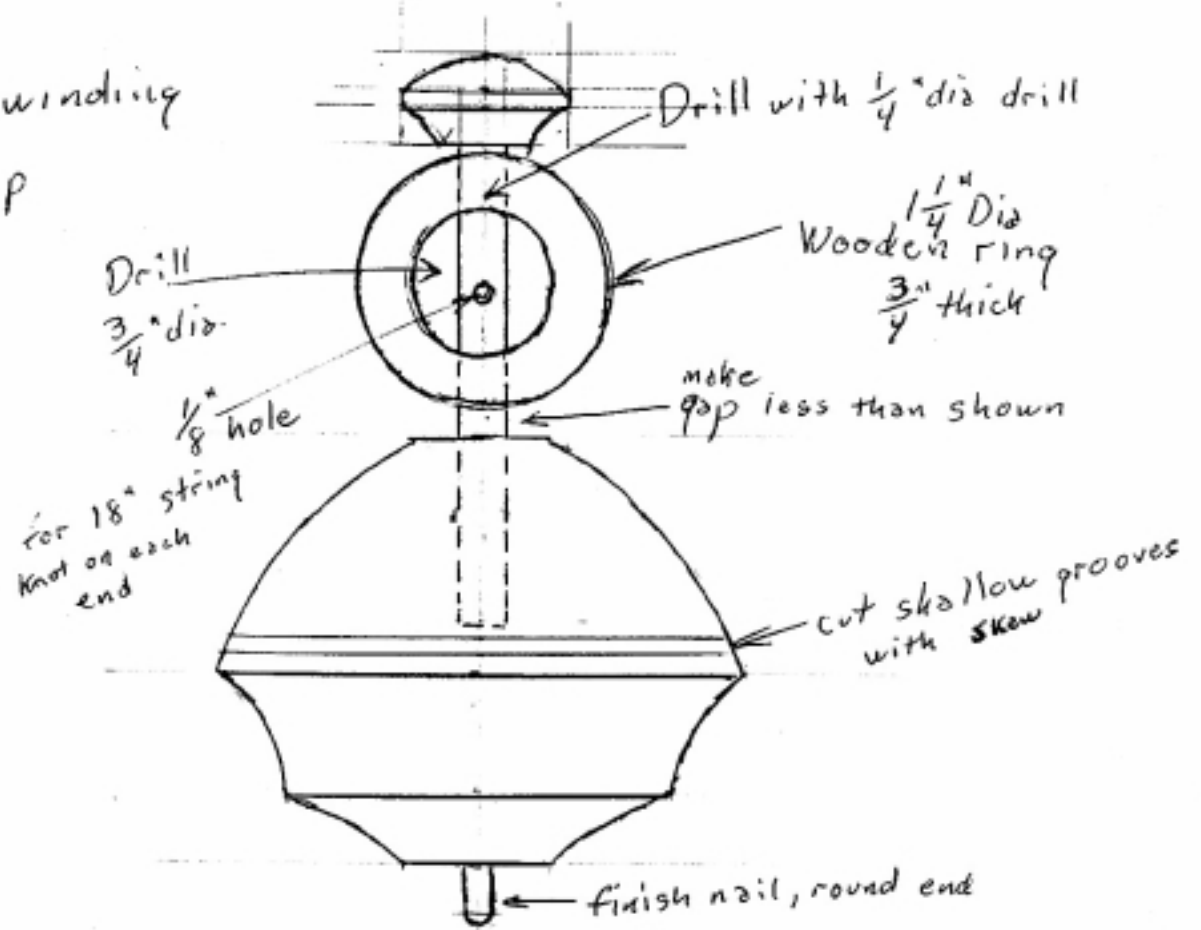
