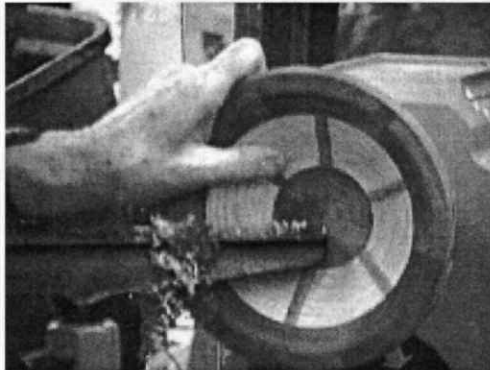

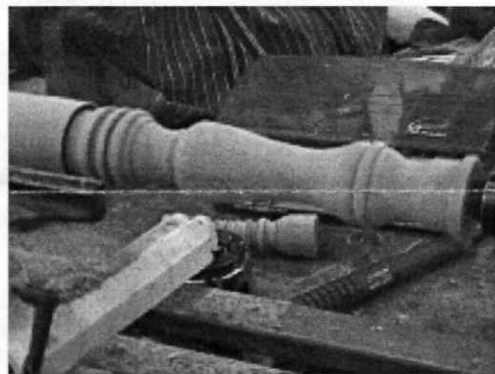

As the wood was very wet it will be a few more months before complete bowls are available for distribution. There is still one piece of wood available.

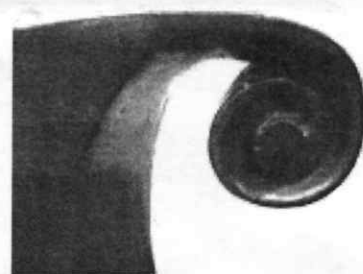
Bob Sutter Described How He Duplicated A Philadelphia Chair Seen and Measured At The N.Y Metropolitan Museum of Art



Carved Leg Detail

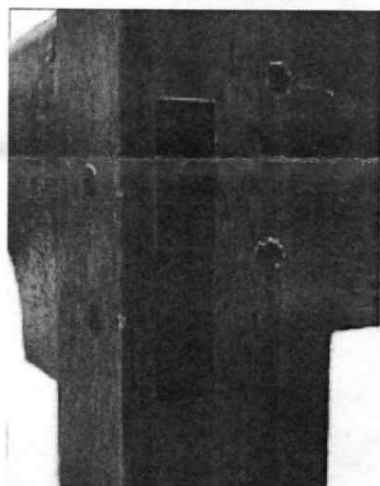


Chair Fabricated 20 Years Ago

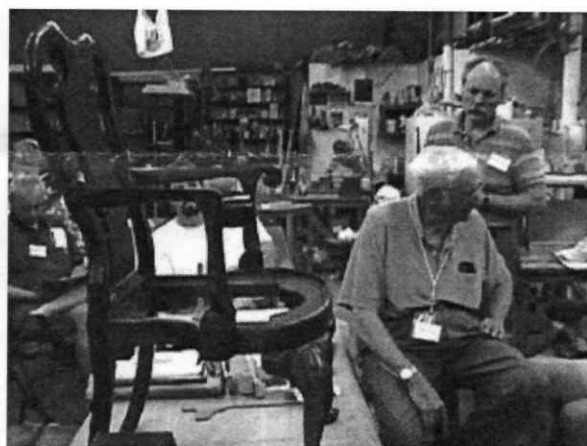


Carved Arm Detail

Legs were bandsawn from square block and shaped with spoke shave, scraper and draw blade.

Bob built the chair in one month from Honduras Mahogany. It is finished with 20 coats of brown shellac. The original chair was built from Walnut.

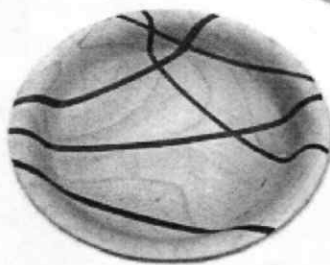

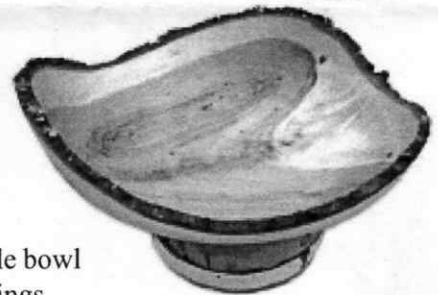

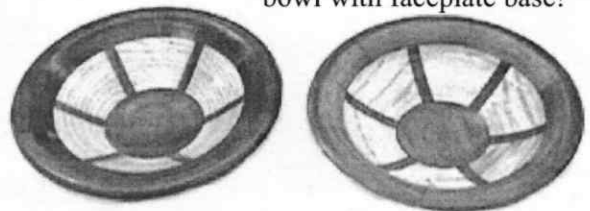


Nigel's Maple, Purple heart and Bubinga plate

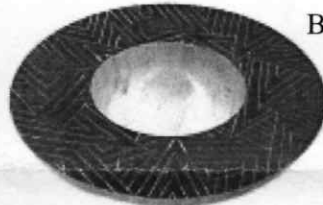
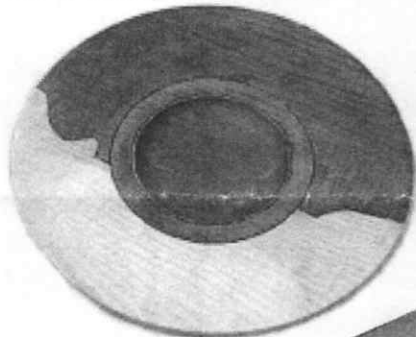
Hank's Spalted Maple bowl with hot pen carvings



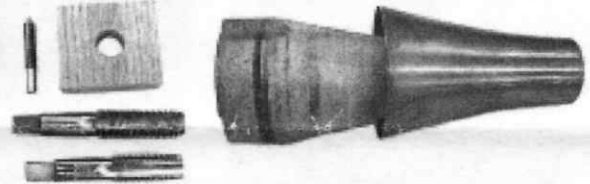

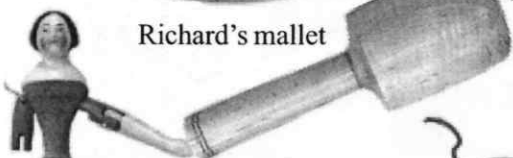

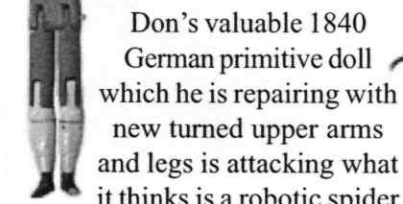

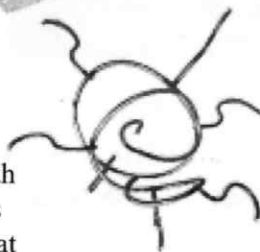

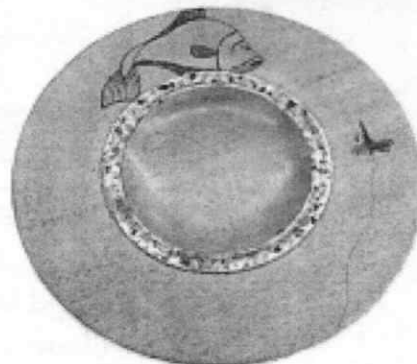
