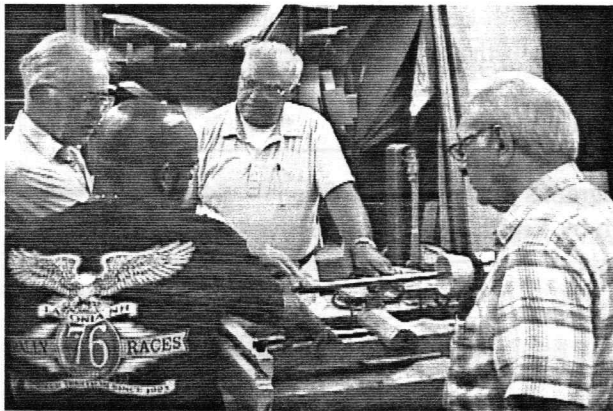

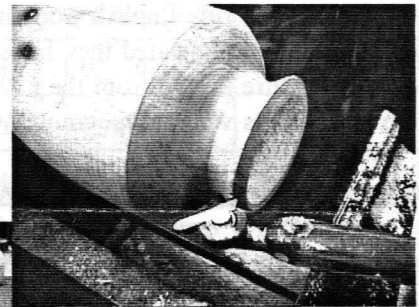

Wally Demonstrates His Hollowing Tool

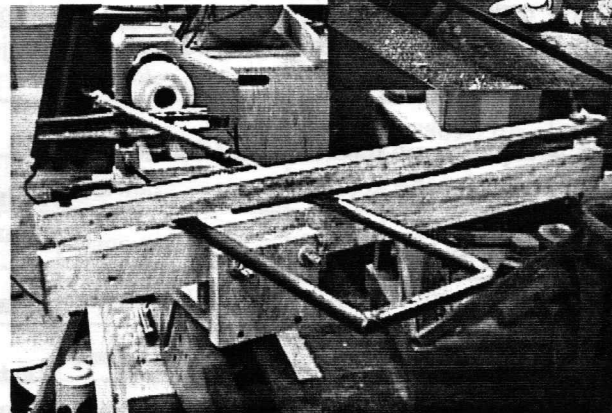


Wally describes fabrication and use of tool to Steve, John and Felix

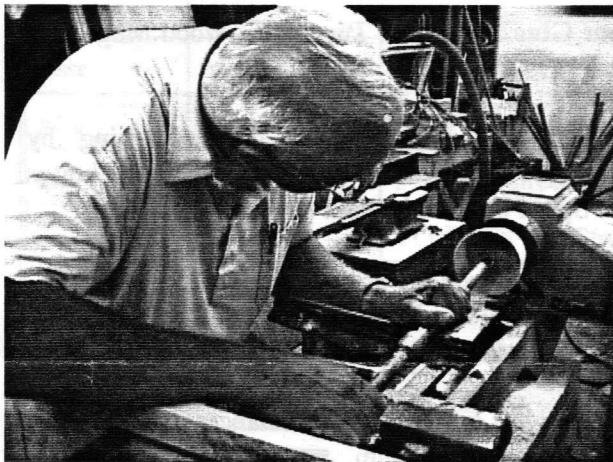

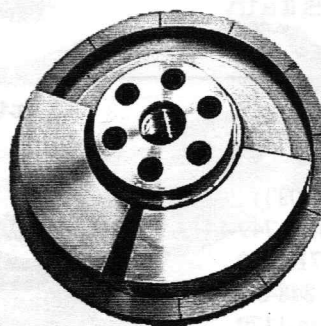

Emilio showed a McNaughton balancer purchased at AAW Tacoma Symposium.



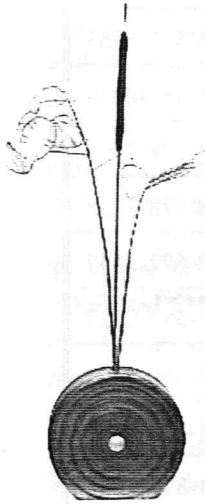

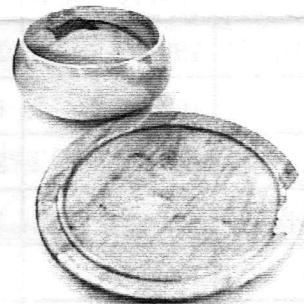

Mal's Wheat Pot



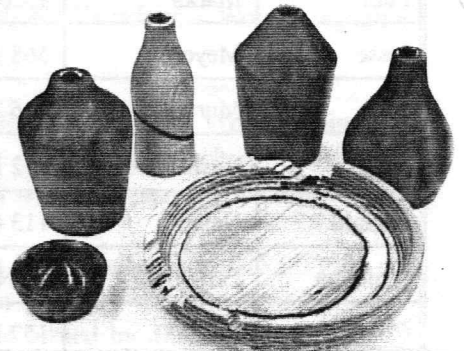

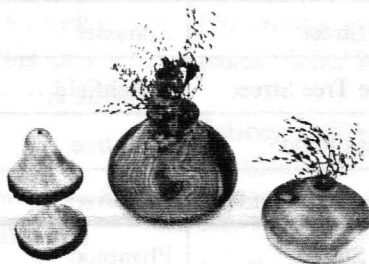

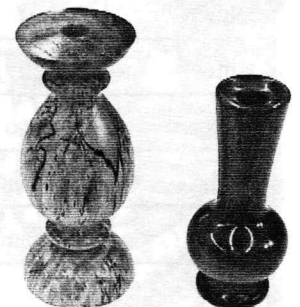
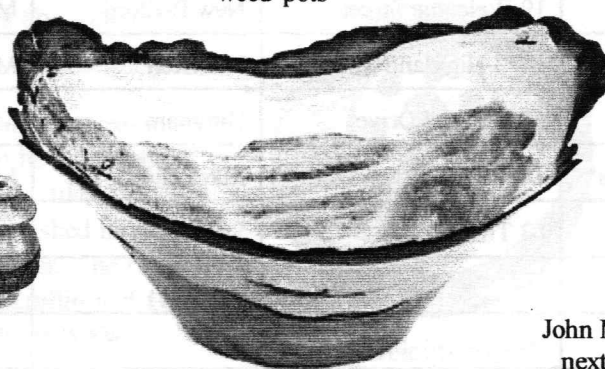
