MEETING DEMO

USING EPOXY by John Burke



John's Demonstration began by introducing us to the two gallon bottles of epoxy resin ingredients that he mixes together. He said they represent a polyurethane resin with a cost of \$170.



Pictured is a sample of a piece of wood impregnated with dyed resin. John told us that he finds that using basic colors of ALUMILITE dye works best with resin, specifically red and blue. He added that he wants a little transparency and a small amount of dye goes a long way.



John demonstrates the beginning stages of mixing the two parts of the polymer resin



Here we see the wood and epoxy mixture positioned in a container and anchored in place with a little tape to stabilize the hardening process which takes 2-4 hours to cure. There are varying time elements depending on the type of epoxy you are using which allow more or less time for mixing ingredients and securing everything before the hardening process begins. John uses a 7-12 minute mixture for placement in the pressure pot.

Here we see an apple wood bowl which he microwaved and then turned. The wood comes from the Arnold Arboretum.





Ken has a natural edge bowl with several shades of dyes epoxy filled in on the side mainly red and green with some added coffee grounds. Ken recommends coloring the wood while it is still wet -you can blend the colors. He drew boundary lines to prevent the colors from running.






Fred also showed us two goblets, one of which has a captive ring. The insides are not yet finished.










Lenny holds a "mistake" from Sid (which he completed) which is a box turned from Silverbell
