





Meeting Minutes

The meeting was called to order at 7:05 pm at Hank Cahill's Dust Bowl

President's Report & General Business

Tom Holland could not make the meeting and will bring his piece for the member raffle at the next meeting, having won at the last meeting.

Secretary Mal Partridge submitted March, April, May and June newsletter expenses to Wally. While at a late visit to Kinko's Mal gave a Gnome engine brochure to the employee servicing him. When he saw Hank Cahill's name he became excited and said "He's a relative of mine"! Mal immediately requested an employee/relative discount, and received it!

A card was received announcing the opening of Mel Scott's *Wood You Remember Gallery* in N.Chatham, MA

The Cahill family sent a card of appreciation for the expression's of sympathy by members of our group.

A sample of what can be done with the Blow Pens currently available at toy stores was shown by **Mal**. They could be used to decorate bowls or other turnings. Spraying over stencils or creating "air brush" illustrations is possible. An interesting and popular item.

Another full size wooden 50HP Gnome Rotary Engine is to be fabricated for a Bleriot replica being built in Canada. The Canadian Aviation Heritage Center @ McGill University, MacDonald Campus has contacted Mal for help after seeing our 1/2 size engine in WW1 Aero magazine. As full size plans are in process for College Park Aviation Museum in Maryland this should not be a problem.

Treasurer **Wally Kemp** reported \$895 in treasury less expenses of approx. \$200.

Librarian **John Murphy** has two new videos for the library. *Hollow Turning* by John Jordan and *Turning Unusual Materials* by Bonnie Klein.

The Cohasset on the Common Fair held June 15,16,17th was reported on by **Roger Hill**. It was too hot, but Sunday was better although it rained at times. A lathe demo from 11-3 on Saturday resulted in no sales. **Hank, Richard, Roger** and **Felix** attended.

The Habitat for Humanity Bird House Auction held recently netted \$41,000!

Audubon Farm Day is Saturday, September 29th.

Arrive by 9 AM for setting up our lathe for demonstrations. There is no White Elephant Flea Market this year.

Ernie reported that he got a free lunch for mentioning that he was a demonstrator. Eyes of those who also were there lit up and looked forward to a freebie.

Our exhibit at South Shore Audubon will run from November 3rd to December 21st. Setup November 2nd 1-2 PM, reception Saturday the 3rd 1-3 PM.Audubon receives 25% of sale price for turnings. We normally have 80-100 pieces on display and some sell the first day! **Mal** will again supply display cards.

Wally supplied handouts of how best to layout and cut logs for turned objects. He also purchased the Epoxy mentioned at the last meeting, Bought 2 units at \$12.50 each with shipping charge of \$25!






Our 50HP Gnome Rotary Engine
