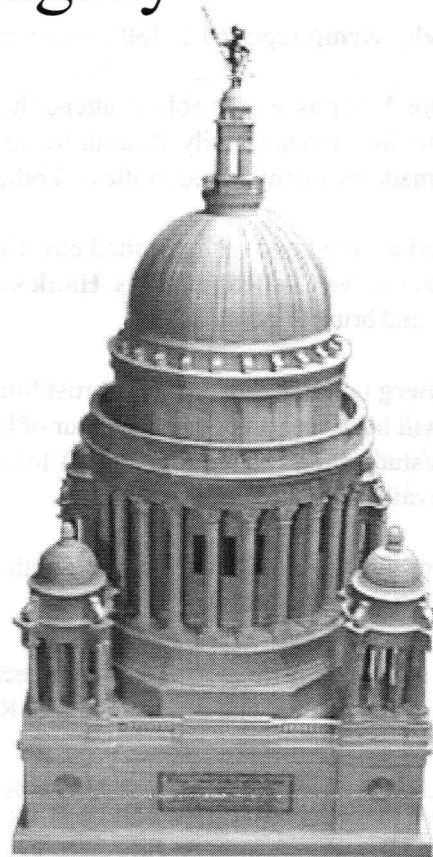
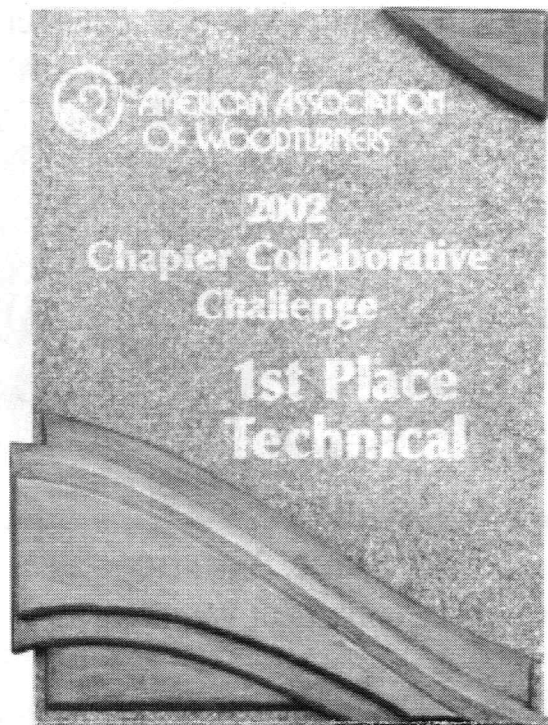

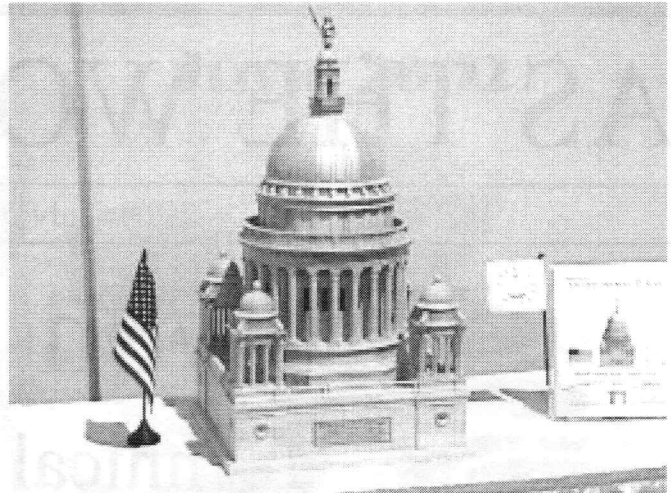
**Roger Hill** received a second place at the South Shore Art Society Festival in Cohasset.

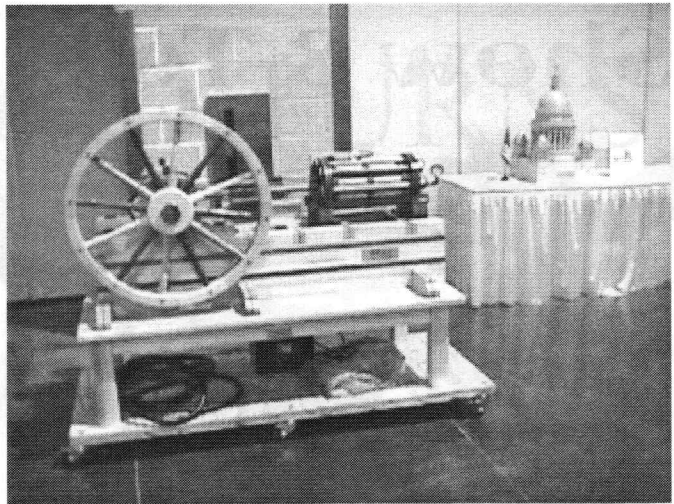

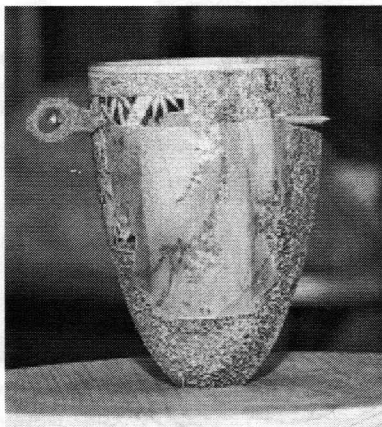

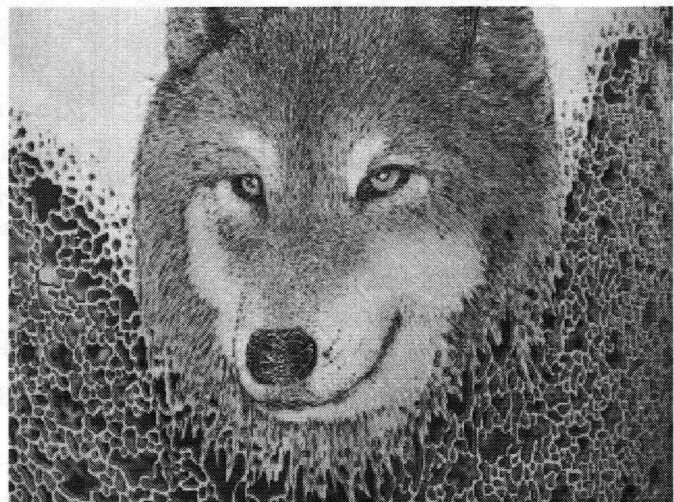

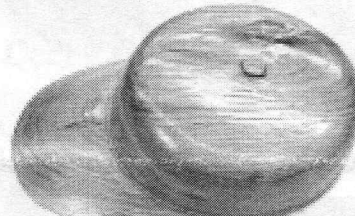
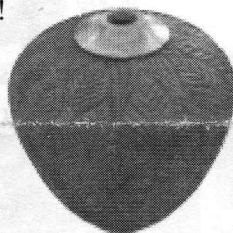
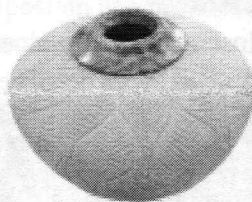
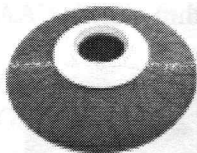
Wally's piece's - one from 110 year old pine

Wally fixed cracks with stranded copper wire lacing and used bow tie's to fix Mike Green's large piece

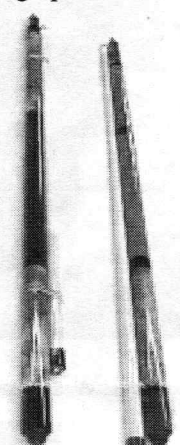


Angelo's hollow vessels - the redwood burl was turned over a period of many years!

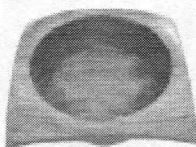
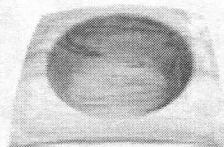
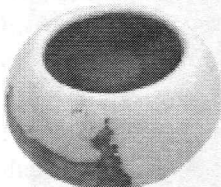
