David Belser gave a demonstration of Precision Machine Woodturning he uses in producing his Safe Box - "The Illusion of Security"



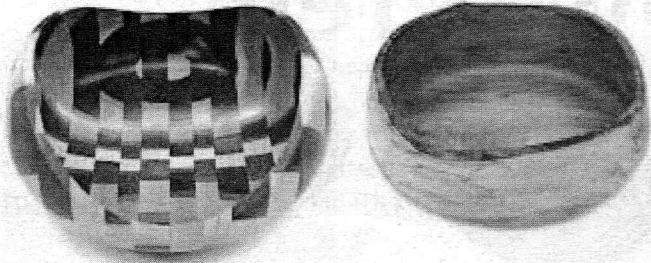
Using a Delta crossslide converts a wood lathe to a machine lathe allowing precise control of the cutter



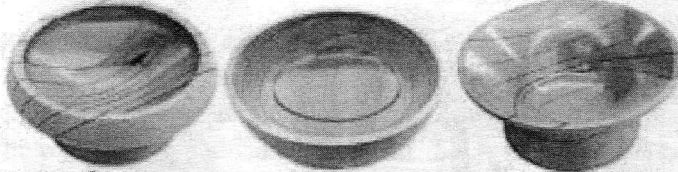
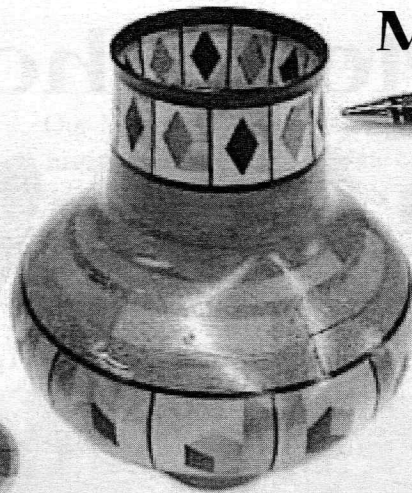

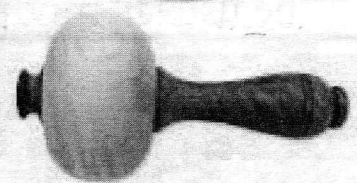
