




Dibble - Member Challenge



Bob Trucchi Demonstrated Using the Skew







Bob attended an Alan Lacer Skew Class in Maine. Grind tool with bevel 1 1/2 times thickness of steel with some radius. Hone after grind. Bob turns poplar eggs first for practice. He turns a morse taper on egg blank for insertion in lathe headstock. Note bowl full of eggs. He also recommends turning beads for practice.
