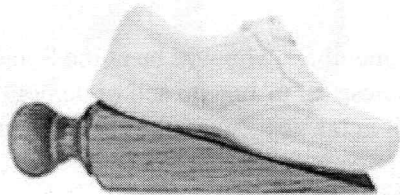
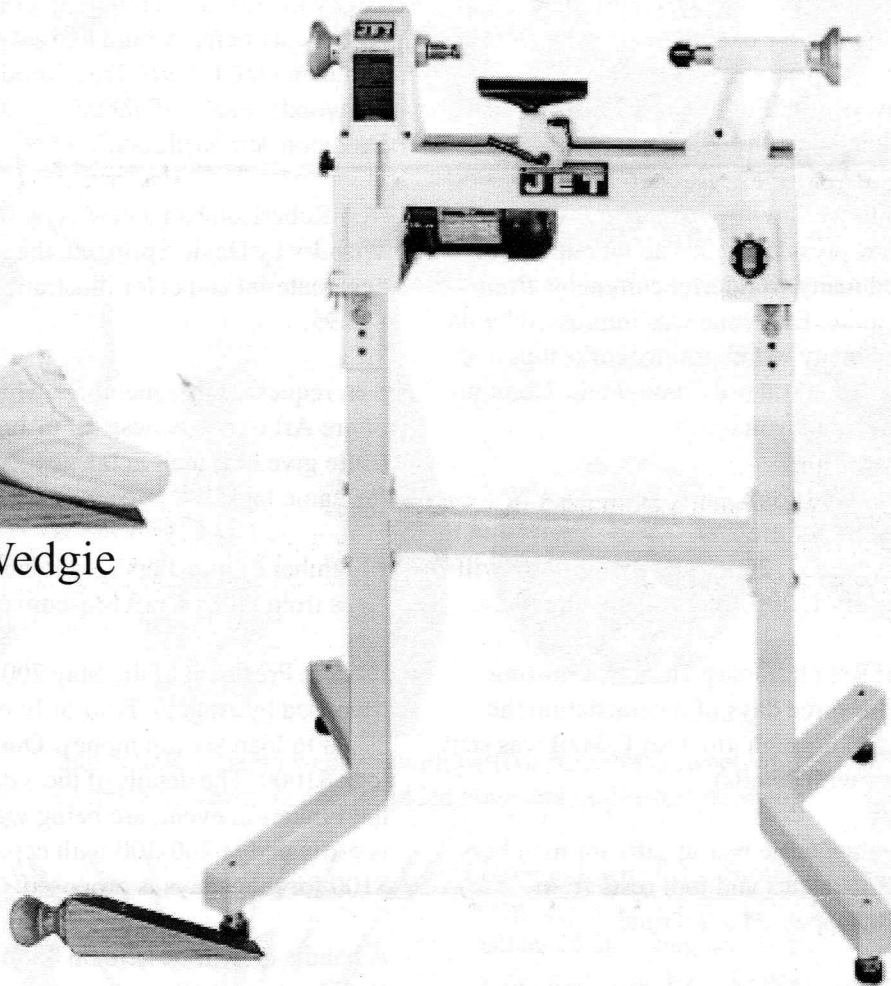

Meeting Minutes

President's Report and General Business

A letter was received from Fuller Craft Museum thanking us for helping with the exhibition Wickedly Wild and Wonderful Wood. They were delighted to host the exhibition and to work with such talented artists. They enclosed a few press clippings about our exhibition. They received many wonderful comments from press and visitors alike. Everyone was impressed by the work as well as the many woodturning workshops and demonstrations we led. "You truly brought the Community Gallery to life. Thank you again."

An E-Mail was received from Carl Vose of AAW alerting demonstrators for the 2007 AAW symposium to contact them by August 31, 2006. The Symposium will be held June 29 to July 1, 2007 in Portland, Oregon.

A number of members sold items and received commissions from Fuller Craft Museum exhibition.

Hank is President of the May 2007 Mini Symposium proposed by Angelo. Four or five clubs have been asked to loan startup money. Our members agreed to loan \$1000. The details of the 3 day event, similar to the Pinkerton event, are being worked out. Attendance is estimated at 200-300 with capacity for 400. A fee of \$100 for the 3 days is proposed.

A hand's on will be held on Saturday May 20th at Hank's shop at 10am. It was agreed that we would have summer MSSW meetings.

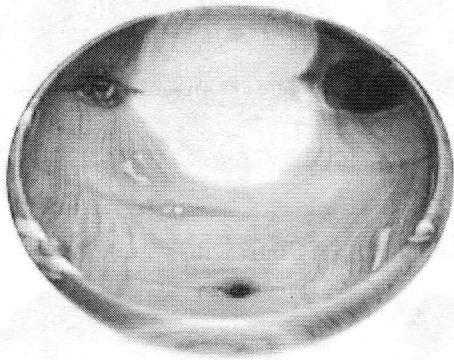
A raffle and wood swap was held.

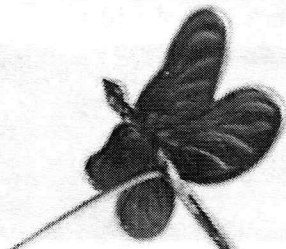
Ron Robertson's cedar bowl and spats for keeping chips out of woodturners shoes



Ken's massive prototype turning for artist's sculpture

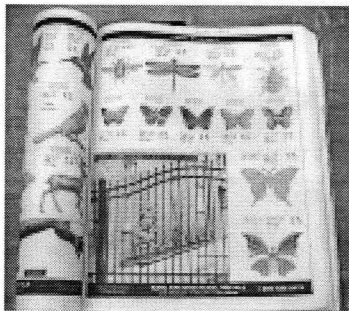


Ben Natale's maple weedpot with pattern from bittersweet vine, cherry burl weedpot, cherry lidded bowl and unfinished doorstop

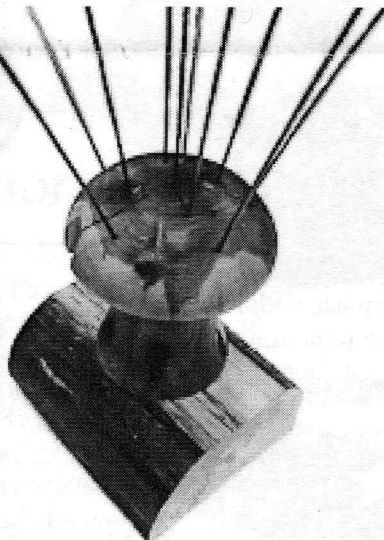

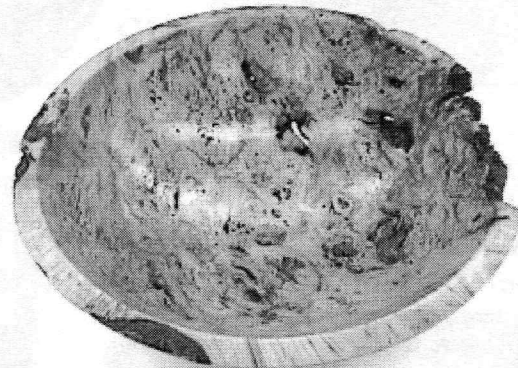

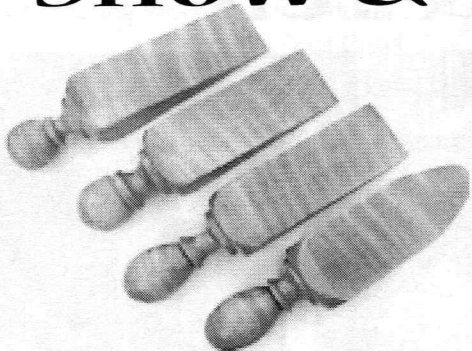

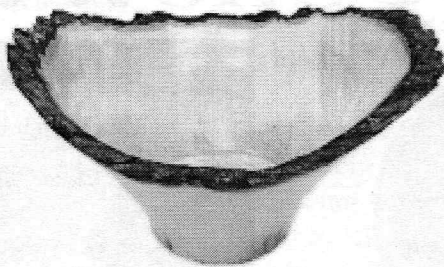

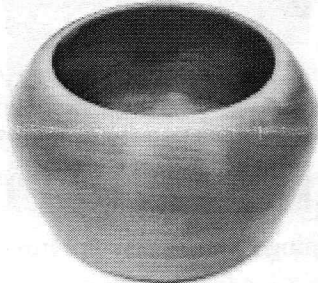

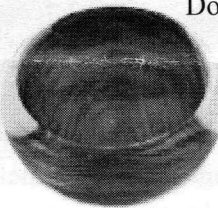

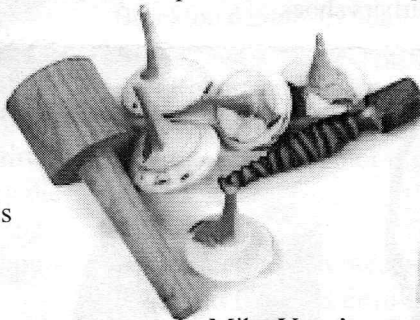

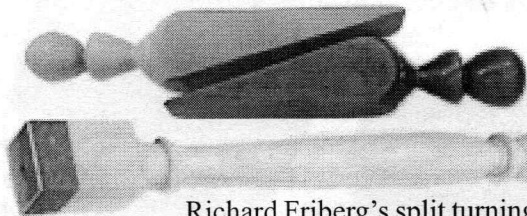

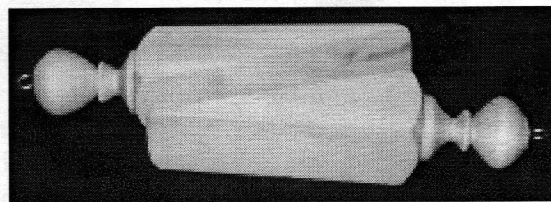

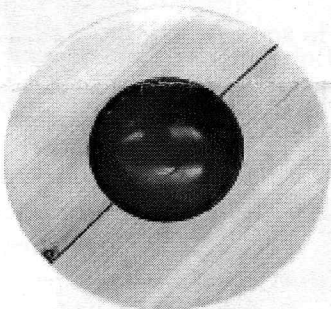

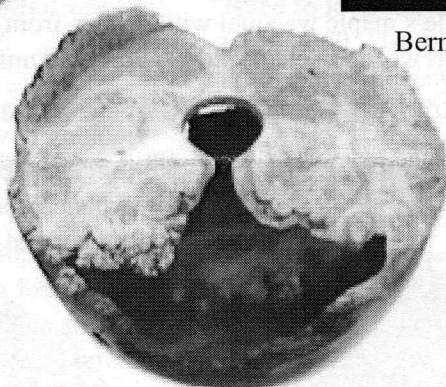

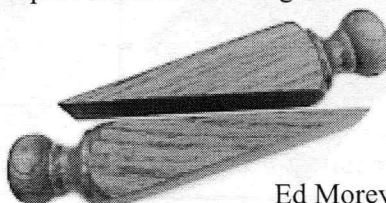
