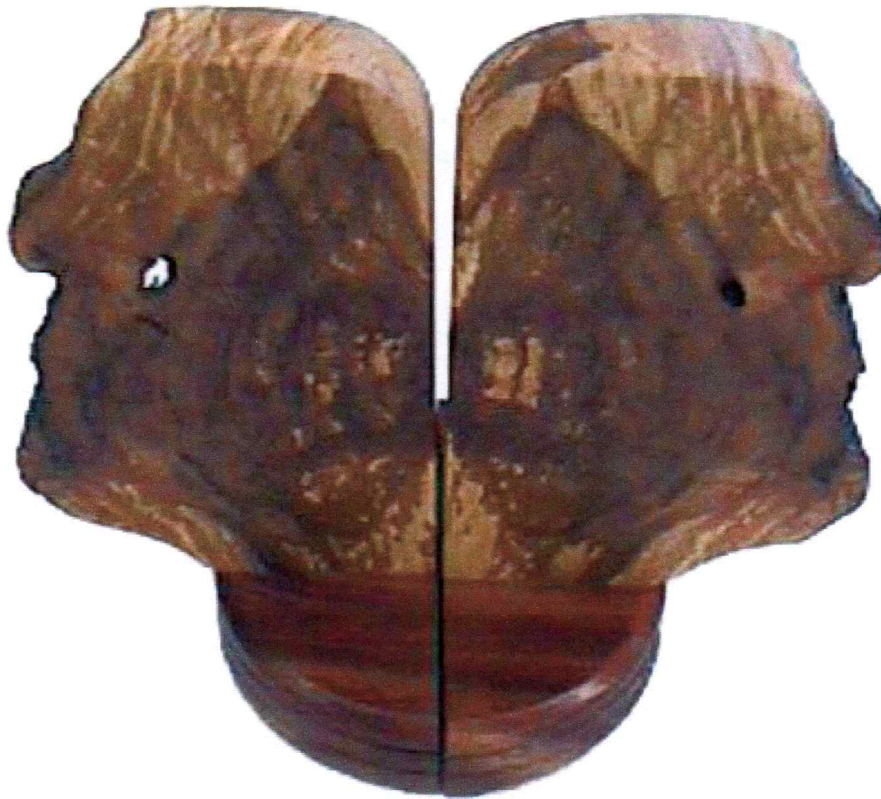

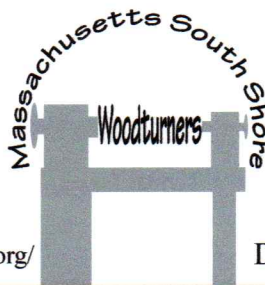
## Let's Face It - Turnings Fun!

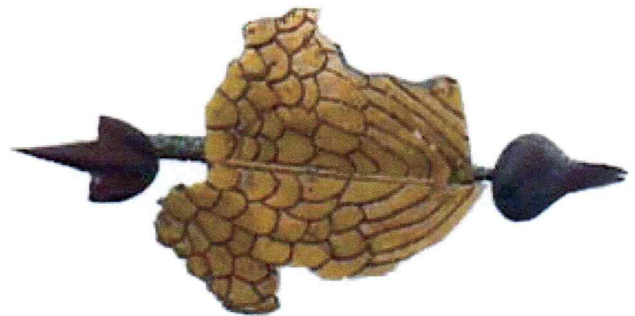

A wood auction was held as well as an auction for the Grumbine bowls.

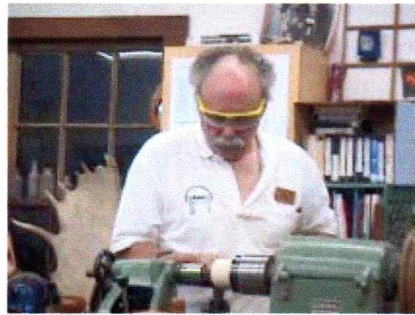


Don showed articulated head for camera boom to allow video camera to follow action during demonstrations.
